The Panathlon Challenges hosted by Greenbank Sports Academy, Liverpool on March 11th and 18th. The Halton squads are made up of 14 students with varying degrees of disabilities including sensory and physical impairments and learning difficulties.

HALTON KEY STEPS 1 & 2 GYMNASTICS


The competition played host to 5 new schools and 30 additional pupils with a total of 12 schools and 21
