This programme is to support Participants who are 19 years or older, to learn and improve their digital skills and future employability.

Open 360 The Runcorn Digital Hub Tackling the Digital Divide

We believe that Digital Inclusion is Social Inclusion



The Runcorn Digital Hub is an approach to engage with local residents who want learn basic IT skills and require access to digital devices/Wi-Fi.

Our aim is to prepare and equip Participants for the new 'normal', tackle the digital divide and new/emerging barriers since Covid-19.

We shall help Participants with maintaining motivation, resilience and connection to digital learning experiences.

All learning activities will be flexible to suit individual Participant's needs, ability & pace.

Participants will have improved well-being, become less isolated and realise prospects for future employability during this programme.

Courses for Aged 19 years old and over:



WARNING ISSUED ABOUT SAFE FIRE SURROUNDS/UNSECURED FURNITURE/TELEVISIONS:

RoSPA and the Health and Safety Executive (HSE) have promoted the importance of safe installation of modular, stone or artificial stone fireplace surrounds following the death of a four-year-old child, who was killed when a fireplace surround fell on him.

Having a fireplace surround installed safely in the home by a professional can often by overlooked during home improvement projects, but for families with children in particular, this could prevent an easily preventable injury or death in the home from the surround toppling on top of a youngster.

Individual components of these fireplaces can weigh more than 50kgs and unless fitted in a secure manner, this makes the mantel, in particular, liable to topple off the lintel.

Advice

RoSPA's advice when buying one of these products is to:

- Seek professional advice BEFORE buying the product. Get assurance that the product you intend to buy is suitable and safe for your home
- Get quotes for the fireplace surround AND fitting in advance. Ensure that the combined cost is within your price range
- Get the fireplace surround fitted by a professional.
