Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope that you are all keeping well.

We have been so pleased to welcome our Nursery students back in for three sessions per week using our school hall, whilst we are waiting for the Foundation Stage classroom to be up and running once again. They are now beginning to settle back in and it has been lovely to see them all working together and meeting up with their Reception friends at snack time.

A quick update on the flooring situation in school:

Temporary wooden flooring has been put down in the foyer and the entrance hall to enable the floor below to be dried with air blowers whilst maintaining accessibility for our staff and students, enabling the school to remain open.

Other areas of the school affected by the flooding have had large heaters installed to clear the moisture before new flooring can be laid.

A number of areas are currently being issued with 'dry' certificates which then means that we are able to move forward with the refurbishment of these areas when safe and practical to do so eg: corridors and toilets can only be done out of the school day.

The Foundation Stage classroom requires a porous surface to be laid before the new flooring and it is hoped that this will be done in the next few weeks.

The multi-sensory room is still being dried and unfortunately is going to take some time to sort, as much of the equipment was damaged and will have to be replaced. We will keep you updated on our progress with this.

The hall floor will require further work on it at some point and these works will be booked in for weekends and holidays so as not to cause any disruption to our students' education.

I would like to thank all of the staff and students who are coping so well with all of the disruption and are remaining positive in what has been a very challenging time.

Covid-19 update:

Thank you to you all for being so supportive in terms of doing the twice weekly Lateral Flow tests with your children, taking them for PCR tests when requested and keeping them off school when they are clearly unwell. So far, we have managed not to have any transmissions in school which is excellent and this has only been possible with yours and the staff's meticulous care and respect for the whole school community. All students of secondary age (12 to 15) who had not already had a covid-19 vaccination were invited by the NHS to get their vaccination in school. A number of parents took up this offer which is great. If you missed out on this opportunity and would like your child to be vaccinated, please look on the NHS covid-19 website for details.

All classrooms have a CO2 detector so that we are able to monitor and open windows when necessary. Please remember to ensure that your child is dressed appropriately so that if windows and doors have to be open in the cold weather, they do not get too cold.

We are slowly allowing more activities to take place in school following risk assessments and careful planning and are hoping that we will be able to invite our Foundation Stage parents in for a Nativity in the school hall and everyone to our Christmas Carols and Songs on the last day in the school playground. These activities will be subject to the covid-19 rates in school on the day and of course the weather for the Carols in the playground. We will send out a message on Parent app on the day to confirm.

Any parents requiring further Lateral Flow Test Kits to use with their children, please contact the school office and we will make sure these get sent home.

Communication with school:

We fully appreciate that is has been almost two years since we have been able to welcome parents into school as regularly as we had done in the past due to the covid-19 restrictions and for some parents this lack of face to face communication has been difficult. This has now been compounded by the fact that our meeting room is one of the rooms that were affected in the flood and with other rooms also out of action, we physically do not have the space to hold face to face meeting with you all. If however, you feel that a face to face meeting is required, we are happy to arrange for you to visit the school in person. Please contact the school office to arrange a convenient date and time.

Sensory Base

This term Sensory Base will be exploring The Arts throughout the world. The children will be researching different artists from the past 100 years as well as recreating their own version of the famous sculptures. This week the children created the Weeping Window poppy sculpture for the class door. One of the sculptures will be the two horse head sculpture that will link into communication and language. Along with continuing to work on their speech and language targets, the children will also be listening to different animal sounds and matching them up to the correct animal pictures. The children began by (virtually) visiting the park and the farm and will soon be exploring pet shops, zoo's even the seaside! Finally the children will be exploring different 2D shapes in maths, exploring different textures with some children recognising shapes and being able to match them.

Secondary 1

This half term the theme in S1 is The Arts. We will be creating some impressionist artwork using ICT in our computing lessons and we will be making sculptures inspired by Henry Moore in Art and DT.

In English we will be studying narrative poetry, and as we have so many jokers in our class we have decided to read and create some funny limericks. In Maths we are starting with 'Time' and 'My Day', moving on to adding and subtracting later in the term. So any added emphasis on the time during specific activities at home (such as meal times, teeth cleaning, bed time etc.) would be really helpful for the students.

We also have some lovely Christmas-themed activities coming up and will be studying Christmas number 1s in Music.

Primary 1

In Autumn 2 our topic is 'Transport' and we are going to explore lots of different types of transport toys and how they move by pulling, pushing, pressing buttons, digging and scooping with them and making them float. We are going to create prints of wheels in different mediums such as paint, clay and playdough and see what marks we can make. We will be enjoying our weekly instalments of our sensory story 'The journey home from Grandpa' and some transport songs. In RE we will be exploring the Christmas story and of course making lots of lovely Christmassy things to bring home. We will continue to work hard on our Communication, Physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy targets too.

We will be looking at the changing seasons and exploring the wonderful colours of autumn through lots of learning outside of the classroom opportunities.

Secondary 3

This half term Secondary 3 will be learning around the topic of 'The Arts'. This will include learning about at how arts and entertainment developed around the Tudor period, as well as studying a range of artistic movements, and producing work inspired by them. We will be learning about different sculptors and attempting to produce our own using different mediums in design and technology. The class will also study Charles Dicken's The Signalman in English, learning about the author as well as the themes of the story. After this they will attempt to write their own chapter where there signalman gets another visit from a spirit.

Primary 3

This half term in P3, our topic is Reduce, Reuse and Recycle! We will be learning all about how to keep our planet and our community clean and safe, whilst looking at things we could cut back on to help save our planet. In art, we are excited to use recycled objects to make models and of course, Christmas decorations! In class, we are currently making an interactive display, where children can sort recyclable objects into plastic, glass, paper and cardboard.

In Literacy, we will be listening to and reading a variety of fictional and non-fictional books, making some chronological reports and describing in steps how we complete processes, such as making toast. In maths, we are working on comparing groups, re-visiting addition and subtraction and learning to tell the time using digital and analogue clocks.

We are extremely excited for all of the Christmas activities and fun we are going to have, making a Santa map, using fieldwork to find the reindeer in the playground and even using ICT to email Santa!
