Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope that you have all managed to have a good summer and get some quality family time.

As we begin the new school year, I am pleased to report that Mrs Helliwell had a baby girl and mother and baby are both doing well.

We welcome some new staff to our team, Rachael Lewis who is now the teacher in Primary 1, Sara Greenlees who is covering Mrs Helliwell's maternity leave in Primary 2, we have a new Higher Level Support Assistant called Clare Kinch-Smith (see her introduction below) and three new support staff - Kate, Michelle and Zara.

We have a number of new students starting with us this year and we would like to welcome them and their families to our Chesnut Lodge community.

We have our first Parents Afternoon / Evening of the year on <u>Thursday 14th October</u> and will be doing this virtually this time due to the continued high levels of Covid 19 in the local community at the present time. Time slots will be sent out shortly on Parent App and you are asked to sign up for the most convenient slot for yourselves.

Unfortunately, following the flood, we have limited room availability in school whilst areas are being refurbished and we will therefore be continuing to hold our Annual Review meetings virtually this term, unless there is a specific reason why a face to face meeting would be more appropriate. During our unexpected closure, it was great to see so many families able to go straight onto using Seesaw to enable their children to continue with their education from home. Could we ask that you all continue to support your child in using Seesaw to complete their homework each week as it then makes things so much easier if we need to return to home learning at any point as you are already familiar with the process and have the appropriate log in details to hand, meaning there is no break in your child's learning.

Secondary 2

Secondary 2 have settled really well back into school after the summer and we have welcomed 4 new pupils into our class.

This term our topic is 'fashion and trends' and we have already completed lots of work around our theme.

In literacy we have been learning about adjectives, we really enjoyed dressing up in costumes and using different adjectives to describe our costumes. We will also be learning about verbs, slogans and alliteration to help us make our own advertisements. In History we have already learnt about Malala, Rosa Parks and the suffragettes. We will continue to look at and learn about influential women.



We wish to remind you that Chesnut Lodge School is an active member of a project that runs jointly between schools and nurseries and Cheshire Constabulary.

Sensory Base

This term Sensory Base will be exploring the different fashion and trends throughout the decades from different parts of the world. The children will be dressing up and strutting their stuff down the catwalk. This will also be linked into Understanding the World where the children will be looking at the different weathers and seasons and the correct clothing that is required for each season. Children will be learning about Numbers in Maths. They will have their own zoo with very hungry animals. The children will have to correctly count out their treats and feed them the correct amount before going on a harvest hunt counting the different harvest items that they find along the way.

Secondary 1

In Secondary 1 this term our theme is 'fashion and trends'. We are doing some exciting activities in our lessons such as designing and making our own fashion item in Art and Design and Technology (DT) and producing an advertisement for it in English. In Personal, Social and Health Education (PSHE) we are learning about consent and how to keep ourselves safe both in the real world and online.

We are all still waiting to welcome a new member to our class, who is unfortunately unwell at the moment, but we can't wait for him to join us.

Primary 1

The pupils in P1 are enjoying their topic 'Everybody matters', they are finding out about themselves through massage and mirror work and finding out about their friends in class through supported turn taking interactions. They are enjoying their sensory story 'Elmer', learning how we are all different but all equally important. They are enjoying collaging their own Elmer and baking lots of yummy Elephant themed food.

All our lovely boys have settled well into our new class. We are spending time getting to know each other and making lots of new friends. This year we are an all boy class and there are "no girls allowed"!

This term our topic is Music Makers.

We are listening to music from different countries and are also making musical instruments. You can come and play a tambourine or shake a shaker that we have made in our art lessons. We will also be making scrapers and string guitars. Look out for us on Britain's Got Talent!!!

In PE we are working on music and movement linked to different sounds. We are developing our co-ordination using apparatus and the whole hall space.

Literacy and Numeracy will be concentrating on shapes, colour and simple adding, reading sound stories and non - fiction books. Focusing on good speaking and good listening skills.

Lots more exciting things are just waiting for us to explore and learn about in Primary 2 and we can't wait for the fun to continue.

Primary 3

This half term, P3 will be working around the theme 'Heroes and Villains'. We will be looking at the good and bad people through history and looking at the positive or negative impact of their actions! We will study people such as Henry VIII, Florence Nightingale and most recently, Marcus Rashford. In Maths, we are looking at numbers, we will start with one more/ less, then lead on to completing addition and subtractions. In English, we have been looking at poems and writing our own superhero poems. We will also be reading myths and fables, looking at the Hare and the Tortoise and Robin Hood, discussing the moral of these stories.

Secondary 3

This half term in Secondary 3 our topic is 'Fashion and Trends'. For this we are enjoying learning about how fashion and trends have developed over the last century and how this has mirrored and also changed society, whilst also learning about some of the key changes for women over the period. We are also designing and making our own t-shirts, learning some new techniques for working with fabric. We have started thinking about peer pressure and how to deal with it in our PHSE sessions as well as learning about some key e-safety ideas in computing.

Secondary 4

Secondary 4 have settled into the new school year well.

This half term S4 are studying a topic called 'Celebrity' in English. We have already found out about Paralympians and some inspirational people from history.

In Maths we are learning about shape. We have learnt the names of some 2D and 3D shapes and are looking at their properties. We are also going to be finding out about types of lines, symmetry and positional vocabulary. We will be taking an Entry level test paper at the end of the unit.

In Science we are studying towards an AQA unit award called Environment, Evolution and inheritance. So we are learning about plants, animals and microorganisms.

We have started making self-portrait sculptures inspired by Picasso. We look forward to showing you photos of these when completed.

Our other topics include E-safety, mental health and wellbeing and line dancing so we are keeping busy! We have already performed our first class assembly which was a mix-up of Roald Dahl's characters. Well done S4 on your performance.
